Children and Families Ministry – Appeal

In January, a team volunteers and staff spent a day reflecting on the ways in which the Abbey community engages with children and families. Many new initiatives have started since we emerged from Covid restrictions, including a Chat, Chocolate and Cards lunch-club at the Middle School, a weekly Games Café at the Abbey, the return of the Take This magazine, the growth of the Abbey Choirs, the family film screenings in the choir stalls, and so much more. Together with our lively Tots' Praise, Messy Church and Cloister Club, these activities provide a varied and rich offer to young children and their families.

None of these initiatives would be possible without the dedicated support of our fantastic volunteers who give so freely of their time and talents. Time and again, we have had feedback to say that our activities are a crucial lifeline to many families (not least in times of crisis) and provide an opportunity for individuals to encounter faith in action.

Good hospitality is crucial to this ministry, but brings with it regular, weekly costs. We would be immensely grateful for any financial support you might be able give towards these costs. If, for instance, everyone in our regular Sunday morning congregation made a one-off donation of just £1, we could provide a sandwich lunch for Hexham First School when they come to explore the themes of Holy Week with us in a couple of days; if everyone gave £5, we would be able to provide a healthy snack for the children who attend Games Café for the entire year.

The work is framed by other music at the beginning and the end – sometimes, but not always, more Bach.
