No Place of Safety:

Working for Reconciliation in the Holy Land

The Abbey is privileged to be hosting a dramatic reading of Johanna Alberti's play *No Play of Safety* in a few weeks' time. As a member of the Ecumenical Accompaniment programme run by the World Council of Churches, Johanna has extensive first-hand experience of the fraught situation in the Holy Land, and in her play she invites audiences to reflect on the witness of those who have been working tirelessly for reconciliation. One such voice is Robi Damelin who encourages us that 'while words alone cannot mend the wounds or bring back the lives lost, they can serve as a reminder of our collective responsibility to end this cycle of violence'.

The dramatic reading of *No Place of Safety* will take place in the Abbey on **Friday, 17 May, at 6pm**, and will be followed by a discussion with Johanna. This event is free (but ticketed!); donations are warmly encouraged: these will go towards the work of Medical Aid of Palestine and the work of the Abbey. You can book your tickets on our website:

Acca Exhibition

SATURDAY 4 MAY – SUNDAY 2 JUNE

Celebrating the Anglo-Saxon heritage of our ancient church, we go in search of an early Anglo-Saxon Bishop Saint called Acca. This exhibition, organized by Abbey conservation volunteers, has been inspired by the magnificent stone-carved monumental cross attributed to Acca in circa 720–30, which is situated near the main entrance in the South Transept. Our research into the history of the Cross has led us to look for the man, Acca, and his place in the history of this place. We hope you enjoy what we have discovered so far. In addition to the exhibition, we have activities for children and adults to enjoy, including an Anglo-Saxon Trail to discover our Anglo-Saxon treasures, a fun 'Battle King' game and a meditative 'labyrinth' activity based upon the vine-scroll carvings on Acca's Cross.

Abbey Maintenance

You will see a lot of work going on in and around the Abbey over the coming few weeks, this includes in the Shop, Priory Buildings and Café as well as the Abbey itself. Next week we will have Hodgson Sayers on site who will be repairing some cracked flags in the Abbey. Whilst this work is taking place, the main Slype entrance will be closed and **the main entrance to the Abbey will be the Cloister Porch.**

You will likely see other contractors on site as we undertake repairs to plumbing and heating, and at the beginning of May we will have some small scaffolding up as Iona Glass finish their repairs to our wonderful stained glass windows!
